You Need To Be Relatable!

If you want to build trust and connection with others, you need to have rapport and engagement. One of the easiest ways to do this via the digital world is to spark interest and show that you are a real person.



Show pictures, use a GIF, and use your words to help "wake" the other person up and create a connection.





Use pictures!

People need to see you to begin forming a relationship with you. Eye contact is one of the quickest ways to expedite this process because we release the hormone oxytocin when we see someone and begin building a connection. Include a picture on your email signature and be sure to use a profile picture everywhere as well. Avatars work, too!

Use GIFs!

Use your words!

Words are powerful! You can use words to prime situations and set the tone of an email or correspondence.

GIFs!


GIFs are delightful and fun, kind of like the throw pillows on a couch. They add a punch of color and zhoosh up the place, but there is a bit of science to their power as well. Scientific research indicates that 90% of the information transmitted to the human brain is visual. GIFs are a great tool to use!

Priming



Set the tone of your interaction with words. The goal when creating a connection with another person in the digital world is to get the person out of autopilot. When you wake the person up, you become an actual human being on the other side.



How do I do that?

Begin by using unique words and less common phrases. Simple tweaks like changing the word "Hello" to "Hello there", "Good Mornin"', "Howdy", and "Happy (insert day of the week)" are easy and less boring ways to show you are relatable.

Greetings & Sign-Offs




Charisma (cont'd)

When you have the ability to inject some personality into your email, DO IT!

- Use a movie quote
- Use a quote from literature
- Use a song title or lyric
- Use a hashtag
- Use emoji's

The key to a charismatic email greeting or closing is to <u>do something unexpected and outside of the</u> <u>norm.</u> Be creative with your email openers and closers. Be different and your email will come across as having more personality.



Superpower Verbs!

A speedy way to sound generic and boring is to use every day, corporate-sounding verbs like provide, improve, enhance, and advance. You see these verbs everywhere and they suck the personality out of your writing! DON'T OVERUSE THEM!



Instead, use magnetic verbs that clearly show and depict action and go from <u>forgettable to flashy</u> in five nanoseconds flat.

Build Connection

Use books, movies, quotes, and songs as an easy way to build and unearth common ground with others.



Sharing what you are reading, your new favorite song, or a movie that inspired you, immediately gives the other person a slice of who you are and allows them to relate to you more quickly.



<u>Leverage the postscript</u>. Sharing information that is unique to you adds a dash of personality and makes you incredibly relatable and memorable. The perfect place to sprinkle in charisma is with the P.S.

- Today's "To Do" list includes (insert something seasonal such as shoveling, planting bulbs, picking tomatoes, drinking pumpkin spice latte)














